- Remain at Muster for roll call and further instruction

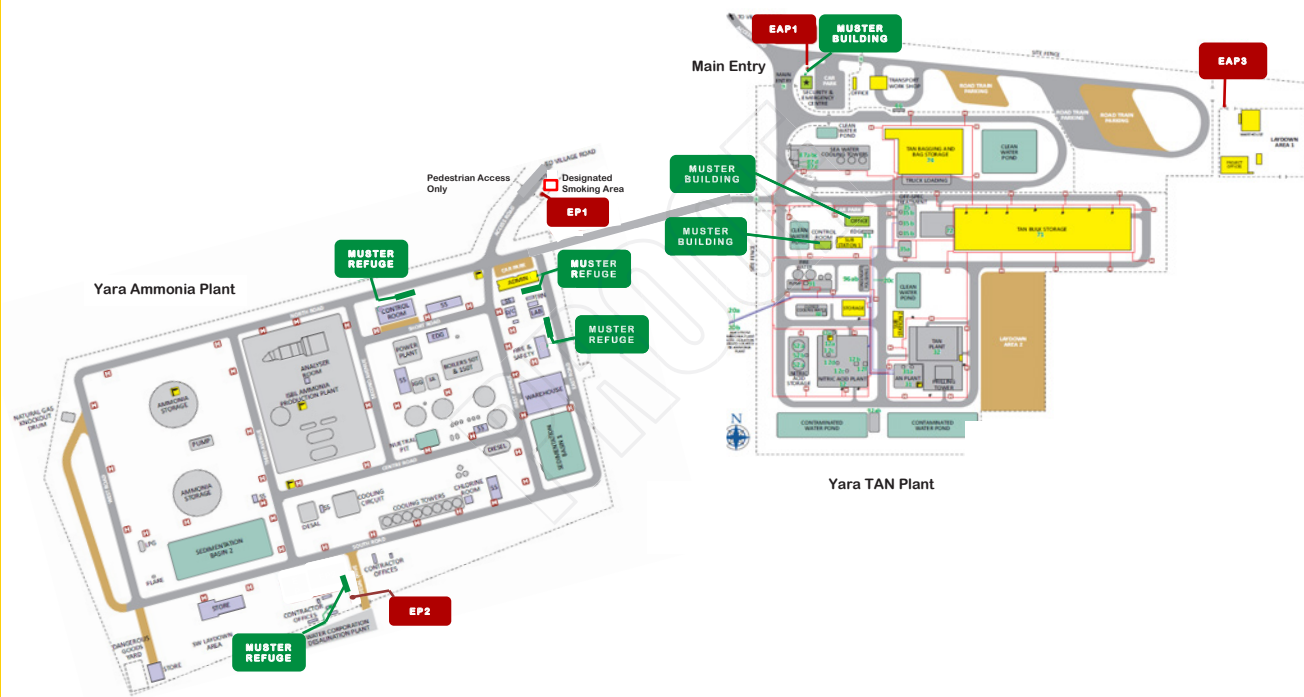
Hazardous situations, accidents or near misses are to be reported immediately to your site contact person.

SAFETY PHILOSOPHY

Our commitment to safety

Employees, contractors, visitors and neighbours, safety is a shared asset that benefits you, your family and all of us.

Yara believes that all accidents and injuries are preventable. For us, safety is a choice, not a chance. Zero accidents is our goal and you are part of the team to achieve it.

YARA SAFETY PRINCIPLES

1 All injuries are preventable and safety is the common basis for our 'license to operate'.

2 Managers (include supervisors) are responsible for:

- 2.1 Reducing risk to as low as reasonably practicable (ALARP).
- 2.2 Setting safety standards and goals, monitoring, auditing and completing agreed actions on time as well as reviewing performance to achieve operational discipline and continuous improvement in safety.
- 2.3 Developing employees to work safely.

3 All employees and contractors are responsible for:

- 3.1 Having the appropriate competence for safe working.
- 3.2 Adhering to safety technical standards and rules at all times.
- 3.3 Addressing own and others 'at risk' behaviours and to reinforce 'safe' behaviours.
- 3.4 Taking immediate action to correct, report and follow up near misses and hazardous conditions.

4 Working safely is everyone's responsibility and is a condition of employment.

Both Yara Pilbara Fertilisers (YPF) and Yara Pilbara Nitrates (YPN) are Major Hazard Facilities. All work at these facilities must be carried out in accordance with the relevant Safety Report.

SAFETY RULES

A Work Permit is required for all Maintenance type activities.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requirements

- Always wear required personal protective equipment.
- The following PPE is mandatory for all (including visitors) in the relevant areas.



Long cotton work wear



Safety glasses



Safety footwear



Safety helmet



Ear protection



Hand protection (as required)



Escape hood (on person)



Can of Diphoterine (on person)

Other Rules and Restrictions



Drugs and alcohol are prohibited



Approved cameras only



No open flame or ignition sources



Smoking prohibited outside designated areas



Phones prohibited within battery limits

Traffic Restrictions

GOLDEN RULES

Observing Yara Pilbara Golden Rules saves lives and prevents injuries.

YARA'S GOLDEN RULES



Working at heights

All work at height shall have a risk assessment and any failure to use of a safety harness when identified shall lead to instant dismissal.



Working with hazardous chemicals

Exposure to chemical risk shall be minimised and where identified in a risk assessment personal protective equipment shall be used.



Working with safety-protected equipment, machinery and control systems

Safety guards and machinery controls shall not be removed without written permission, normally a permit to work.



Working on energised equipment

All energy sources shall be de-energised and locked out prior to commencing work.



Working in Confined Space

All work in confined space shall have written authorization before entry. Isolations from all connecting pipework and energy sources, valid gas tests and a safety watch shall always be present.

Breach of a Golden Rule will trigger immediate disciplinary response.
